

Survival Guide for AAC



This session is the first of its kind at ATIA. It is designed to provide family members and any accompanying AT and allied health professionals with information, resources and tools to guide them in exploring exhibits and sessions at ATIA with the goal of supporting their family member or client who requires augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) intervention. As a parent, caregiver or teacher of a child who requires AAC, the number of different speech-generating devices and treatment strategies available can be overwhelming. Even if that individual already has an AAC system, you may be asking, “What can we expect?” “Where should we go first, second, next?” “What are the best questions to ask?” or “How can we better support their use of AAC to communicate effectively?” During this session you will work through a “Survival Guide” that will help you understand the role of language development and representation in AAC systems, how to best support the AAC user and the different AAC solutions available at ATIA to help you do that.
